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



A sensory space gives kids an opportunity to take a break from the classroom environment to process feelings and work through whatever is getting in the way of their learning. Stepping stones, balance boards, hopscotch rings and building block walls create sensory pathways that offer students a designated space to move through developmentally appropriate sensory activities. Students learn how to selfregulate and then confidently return to the classroom, focused and ready to learn.
